

Allt Dearg Educational Trust - Annual Report at 31st July 2015

2014-15

In our second year we received 29 applications. We awarded grants to 15 young people totalling £15,000. We expect to support them throughout their course.

2 of the young people were unable to take up their places and their grants have been held over to start in 2015-16.

11 young people who first received grants in 2013-14 continued their courses in 2014-15, so in 2014-15 the Trust supported 24 young people, with grants totalling £31,222.
