In our third year we received 17 applications. We awarded grants to 12 young people totalling £12,000. We expect to support them throughout their course.

7 young people who first received grants in 2013-14, and 8 young people who first received grants in 2014-15 continued their courses in 2015-16, so in 2015-16 the Trust supported 27 young people, with grants totalling £31,722.
