

Allt Dearg Educational Trust - Annual Report at 31st July 2018

2017-18

In our fifth year we received 44 applications. We awarded grants to 33 young people totalling £32,000. We expect to support them throughout their course.

2 young people who first received grants in 2013-14, 5 young people who first received grants in 2014-15, 4 young people who first received grants in 2015-16 and 16 young people who first received grants in 2016-17 continued their courses in 2017-18, so in 2017-18 the Trust supported 60 young people, with grants totalling £61,500.
